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Curriculum information

Reading at home



Reading is a key life skill and through our Read Write Inc reading and phonics scheme we support children to develop skills that support children to read with confidence, enjoyment and have a love for reading. We really want to share with you how important it is to read with your child at home.

Your child is given a discussion book, or reading book with a reading dairy that goes home daily.

At present we really would like to encourage parents to comment in the reading diary when your child is heard read at home. But we will be launching our Boom reading soon, please look out for the image in future letters that we will share with you!



Please take time with your child/ren to support children to read as shared in the 10 top tips for parents.

- Encourage your child to read.
- Read aloud regularly.
- Encourage reading choice.
- Read together.
- Create a comfortable environment.
- Make use of your local library.
- Talk about books.
- Bring reading to life.

Book share

Our book share was very successful last year! thank you parents and children for participating. We invite you and encourage parents to invite your child to visit the school office and choose a book to read at home and then return it to school and choose another one. At the moment, we are organising other book share stations in KS1 &KS2 areas for easy access.

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Homework

Just a gentle reminder that homework is set and located on Purple Mash weekly, or paper copies are shared with your child. Please ensure that you check DO-JOS to help you track you child's journey and achievements. With Purple Mash, your child has been given a log in with a username and password. If you are having problems or do not have log in, please let us know, so that we can help. As part of weekly homework, it is very **IMPORTANT THAT CHILDREN ARE HEARD TO READ AND CHILDREN ARE READING AT HOME**.

Physical Education is an important part of our school curriculum. Please ensure that your child has their PE kits in school ready to take part in PE lessons.

A reminder that for the Autumn Term, children should come to school wearing their PE kit (tracksuit) on their designated PE day listed above. PE kit to school - this should consist of a plain white T-shirt and black/ blue joggers, school jumper or cardigan pumps or sensible trainers. I would like to remind you that this is the only agreed PE kit in school.

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School Uniform

Thank you parents for your support with our school uniform policy at St Philip's Catholic Primary School. The children have returned to school looking very smart in their uniforms. Please can I remind parents to write your child's name on all items of clothing of your child. Please let us know if you are in need of items of uniform as we may be able to help!

<u> Polite reminder — Hairstyles</u>

Thank you for continuing to support our policy on appropriate hairstyles for school. Just a reminder that during term time there should be no hair sculptures or tram lines, shaving, highlights or hair colouring of any description. Extreme hairstyles should only be considered at the beginning of the summer holiday. Please continue to support us this term. Thank you.

Jewellery

Please take care not to send your children into school with looped earrings, necklaces or expensive pieces of jewellery. It is important to note that jewellery can be broken or lost in school and not suitable for play or PE activities.

AIP Catering

Free School Meals and KS1 Universal Free School Meals children – If your child is a Free School Meal child or is in EYFS or KS1 they are entitled to a free school lunch which would be a hot meal from the school canteen.

If you would rather send your child in with their own packed lunch you are welcome to do so BUT... (please remember no nuts (including Nutella), tomatoes or oranges as we have children with severe allergies in school).

Please book online on SCHOOL FOOD UNITED TO BOOK YOUR CHILD'S PREFERRED LUNCH OPTION. If you are having trouble logging in or creating your School Food United account, please come and see Mrs Slater in the School Office.

If your child is in KS2 classes and are not Free school meals/pupil premium then ALL MEALS NEED TO BE PAID FOR .

Please remember if you pay for school meals to please clear your balance on a daily balance. Any problems come and see the School Office.

All children should still bring their own filled water bottle each day which needs to be taken home at the end of each day and washed and brought back the following day.

Healthy Choices

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We continue to be proud of our Platinum Healthy School Award. Please support your children to make healthy choices for break times and at lunchtimes in their lunch boxes. Please choose the children's snacks with a careful thought. We are seeing a rise in unhealthy snacks across school. Please check your child's lunchboxes and this will give you an indication of how much your child has eaten. Please note that school provides a piece of fruit at breaktime for your child. Thank you for your support.

Afterschool Clubs

We endeavour to support all families with offering the afterschool club chosen for your child. However, we cannot always guarantee this be the case as clubs are very popular and oversubscribed. We hope that all children are granted one club of their choice that they can participate in and all children are able to engage in.

We do ask that if your child has been granted a club, they must ATTEND ALL SESSIONS. If they do not attend 2 consecutive sessions their place will be allocated to another child, and we will notify you, if this is the case.

If your child attends a club and does not demonstrate good choices, behaviour or is disruptive or disrespectable in the club, sadly this is a conversation with parents that could result in your child losing their place. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Contact Details

We have sent all parents paper forms home to be completed and returned to school, please ensure that the forms do come back to school as it is very important that school has the most up to ate contact details of your telephone numbers. If you have changed your contact details, please pop into the office and let the school know. We want to ensure that we can contact you directly in the case of an emergency or if your child falls ill or has an injury at school during the school day.

Attendance

There has been new guidance on school attendance that has been launched at the start of our academic school year.

Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. Please ensure that you endeavour to get your child to school and in on time for 8:50 am. The playground opens at 8:40am and the official start to the school day is 8:50 am. If your child arrives to school after the registers close, they will receive a late mark that is recorded on your child's attendance record. If your child is ill and is unable to come to

school, you must call school on the first day of their absence (and any further days) to inform the school office of the reason for the absence. Any medical appointments that are unavoidably in school hours must show proof of appointment to the school office. The school office number is 0121 558 1643.

On the third consecutive day of any absence, school will carry out a welfare check via telephone or a home visit.

If your child's attendance drops below 85% then you will be invited to a meeting with school staff such as the Learning Mentor, Attendance Officer or Vice Principal to offer support with improving your child's attendance.

Any further meetings with regards to attendance concerns below 80% will be escalated to the Principal.

Please also remember that taking holidays in term time will affect your child's schooling and we ask for your co-operation to not take your child away in school time as this will be UNAUTHORISED and you could be at risk of a fine from the Local Authority of Sandwell.

<u>Safeguarding</u>

We are dedicated to safeguarding our young people at St Philip's Catholic Primary School. If you have any concerns with safeguarding, then please speak with a member of staff or myself and we will endeavour to help and support.

Could I please request that if your child has an injury that has happened at home or outside of school could you please be so kind to let us know. Telling us would avoid myself from contacting you unnecessarily. If you do have a concern or would like to talk to someone in confidence about a safeguarding concern, then I am the Designated Safeguarding leader (DSL) in school. Deputy Designated Safeguarding Officer is **Mrs Anslow** and Safeguarding Officers are **Miss Reaney**, **Mrs Davidson and Mr Padaton**. Our safeguarding policy is available on our website to help and support you with how safeguarding works in our local authority of Sandwell and the Multi academy Company of the Emmaus MAC.

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Nursery places — Please see the information below!

We have nursery places available now! If you have child that has turned 3 years old or will be within the term, please get in contact and we will be happy to support with completing the application forms and supporting you.



Please note! if your child is in year 6 currently ...

You can now apply for a secondary school place for children starting Year 7 in September 2025.

The closing date for applications is 31 October 2024.

Any applications received after this will be treated as a late application. You can only apply for a place to start secondary school in 2025 if your child's date of birth falls between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014.

You can now apply for a Reception School in September 2025.

The closing date for applications is 15 January 2025

Any applications received after this will be treated as a late application. You can apply for a place to start Reception in September 2025 if your child's date of birth falls between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021.

Open Day Nursery and Reception 2025

On Wednesday, 16th October 2025 there is an Open Day for you to come and visit the school for Nursery and Reception places for 2025. The timings are as follows:

10.00 am - 11.00 am and 1.30 pm - 2.30 pm.

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Keep in touch

We are here to serve you and it is our pleasure to help. Your child's safety, happiness and academic progress are the reason why every single member of staff is here. If you are concerned about any aspect of school life - no matter how small - it's really important to let us know. The sooner we know about things the sooner we can do our best to sort things out. The teachers and teaching assistants can take quick messages on the door before and after school - if you need a longer, private conversation please call the school and the member of staff that you need to speak with will be in contact with you.

Change of circumstances

It's important for us to know that if your personal circumstance have changed you may be entitled to Free School meals. You can help the school to access precious funding for years to come (called Pupil Premium) by registering for free school meals Please apply for free school meals if you are on a low income and / or receive benefits. As well as receiving a free school meal very day (if you choose to take it) you will generate significant funding for our school for many years to come - finding that is all spent on better provision for the children. If you think that you may qualify, please pop into school and speak to Mrs Slater.
