Please can we request that **YOU DO NOT** park on the **CAR PARK**. It is a small area and there are blind spots where pedestrians maybe which can cause a health and safety issues or an accident. If your child/ren are entering through the school reception area, please ensure that an adult is escorting your child/ren safety into the school building.

KS1 Playground equipment

Could I please ask children **NOT** to use the playground apparatus and equipment after school once parents/carers have collected children from the KS1 classes. We want children to stay safe and free from accidents. Thank you.

Uniform, PE Kits and Healthy lifestyles.

Thank you parents for supporting our uniform policy and sending your child/ren into school so smart. A gentle reminder that there should be NO hair sculptures or tram lines, shaving, highlights or hair colouring of any description. Extreme hairstyles should only be considered at the beginning of the summer holiday. Thank you so much for your support and understanding.

Physical Education is an important part of our school curriculum. Please ensure that your child has their PE kits in school ready to take part in PE lessons. A reminder that children should come to school wearing their PE kit (tracksuit) on their designated PE day listed below.

<u>PE kits for school</u> should consist of a plain white T-shirt and black/blue joggers, school jumper or cardigan, pumps or sensible trainers. I would like to remind you that this is the only agreed PE kit in school. <u>**Jewellery**</u> - Please take care not to send your children into school with looped earrings, necklaces or expensive pieces of jewellery. It is important to note that jewellery can be broken or lost in school and not suitable for play or PE activities.

Healthy Choices

We continue to be proud of our Platinum Healthy School Award. **Please support your children** to make healthy choices for break times and at lunchtimes in their lunch boxes. Please check your child's lunchboxes and this will give you an indication of how much your child has eaten. Please note that school provides a piece of fruit at breaktime for your child. AIP Catering

Free School Meals and KS1 Universal Free School Meals children - If your child is a Free School Meal child or is in EYFS or KS1 they are entitled to a free school lunch which would be a hot meal from the school canteen. If you would rather send your child in with their own packed lunch you are welcome to do so (please remember no nuts (including Nutella), tomatoes or oranges as we have children with severe allergies in school). Please book online on SCHOOL FOOD UNITED TO BOOK YOUR CHILD'S PREFERRED LUNCH OPTION. If you are having trouble logging in or creating your School Food United account, please come and see Mrs Slater in the School Office.

All children should still bring their own filled water bottle each day which needs to be taken home at the end of each day and washed and brought back the following day. Please remember if you pay for school meals to please clear your balance on a daily basis. Any problems come and see the School Office.

<u>Attendance</u>

Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. Please ensure that you endeavour to get your child to school and in on time for **8:50 am**. The playground opens at **8:40am and the official start to the school day is 8:50am**. If your child arrives to school after the registers close, they will receive a late mark that is

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recorded on your child's attendance record. If your child is ill and is unable to come to school, please contact the school office on 0121 558 1643 and leave a message or speak to Mrs Slater. Please remember that taking holidays in term time will affect your child's schooling and we ask for your co-operation to not take your child away in school time as this will be UNAUTHORISED.





Reading at home, reading for pleasure !

Reading is a very important tool and life skill. We would like to share how important it is to read with your child at home. I know and understand that home life can be very busy, but we do encourage daily reading with your child to help improve their confidence with fluency and comprehension. To help our children to do this, we have launched **"Book Swap"** this has been a huge success! Please come with your child/ren to choose a book for pleasure and enjoyment, take it home and once your child/ren has read the book, return it to school and swap it for another book of your choice. So far, this has been really popular with our children and they love the idea to be able to read and swap a book!

<u>Birthdays</u>



A reminder that if it is your child's birthday, we welcome your child to wear their own clothes to school and that they can come and collect the 'Happy Birthday bear' to be their friend for the

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day. So far, the children have really enjoyed having the birthday bear as their friend for the day.

Afterschool clubs

We endeavour to offer your child/ren an afterschool club of their choice, one guaranteed club for every child in school. However, we have had to look carefully at afterschool clubs because of staffing availability in school and health and safety with staff ratios to ensure the safety of children and staff.

A gentle reminder to share with you, that if your child has been offered a club afterschool, please ensure that your child/ren attend weekly. When your child attends their afterschool club, they are expected to follow the behaviour rules of our school. If your child's behaviour is causing a concern to us, we will speak with you about this and look at a way of resolving the behaviour concerns. We do not want the result to be that your child cannot attend the clubs, but if the actions and choices of your child is causing severe concern, are not following instructions, presenting a health and safety concern, then we will have to talk with you about moving forward with accessing your chosen club.

Nursery places — Please see the information below!

<u>Safeguarding</u>

We are dedicated to safeguarding our young people at St Philip's Catholic Primary School. If you have any concerns with safeguarding, then please speak with a member of staff or myself and we will endeavour to help and support.

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Could I please request that if your child has an injury that has happened at home or outside of school could you please be so kind to let us know. Telling us would avoid myself from contacting you unnecessarily. If you do have a concern or would like to talk to someone in confidence about a safeguarding concern, then I am the Designated Safeguarding leader (DSL) in school. Deputy Designated Safeguarding Officer is **Miss Reaney**, and Safeguarding Officers are **Mrs Davidson- Pope and Mr Padaton**. Our safeguarding policy is available on our website to help and support you with how safeguarding works in our local authority of Sandwell and the Multi academy Company of the Emmaus MAC.

Polite reminder about conduct on the playground and school premises

We would like to thank our school family for their support, kindness, manners, patience and conduct on the playground. It is a pleasure to meet with you every day. Unfortunately, I have to share with you that there have been a few incidents where a small number of parent visitors to our premises have not been respectful in the correct manner resulting in staff, parents and children feeling upset and uncomfortable.



The types of behaviour which are unacceptable and will not be tolerated are:

• shouting, either in person or over the telephone;

• using intimidating / abusive language or behaviour in person, in written communication (such as emails or letters), or on online social media platforms (including but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, YouTube, WhatsApp, Instagram and Google);

• using defamatory language or language which could cause unjustified reputational damage to the school, its staff or governors, in person, in written communication (such as emails or letters) or on online social media platforms (including, but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, YouTube, WhatsApp, Instagram and Google);

• any other behaviour likely to cause anybody witnessing it (including the recipient) alarm, distress or to fear that violence may be used against them or others.

This is a Catholic school where we aim to model to our children how to be respectful and tolerant to each other through compassion and love. I have the privilege of seeing how hard our staff work behind the scenes, they go above and beyond for the children in their care. They chose this profession to make a positive difference. There will, naturally, be moments where things go wrong, and issues need to be resolved. When these issues occur, we want to help and support - please do not take your frustrations out on our staff. Likewise, if there are issues between families we would ask, respectfully, that these issues do not spill onto our premises and be witnessed by our pupils. My sincere thanks and gratitude for your support with this matter.

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Change of circumstances

It's important for us to know that if your personal circumstance have changed you may be entitled to **Free School meals**. You can help the school to access precious funding for years to come (called Pupil Premium) by registering for free school meals Please apply for free school meals if you are on a low income and/or receive benefits. As well as receiving a free school meal every day (if you choose to take it) you will generate significant funding for our school for many years to come - finding that is all spent on better provision for the children.
